MISSION STATEMENT

Hunger Plus, Inc. is a not for profit relief agency dedicated to the reduction and elimination of hunger worldwide through feeding programs combined with projects that promote self-reliance.

On October 11, 2010, it was reported that the number of malnourished people in the world exceeded 1 billion people, about a sixth of the world's total population.

According to estimates by the [FAO](#) there were 925 million undernourished people in the world in 2010. This was a decrease from an estimate of 1023 million undernourished people in 2009. The same organization reports that there were 923 million malnourished people in the world in 2007, which in turn represented an increase of 80 million since 1990. The FAO purports that the world already produces enough food to feed everyone — 6 billion people — and could feed double — 12 billion people.

As the number of hungering people is a subset of the under- or malnourished number, the number of people in hunger is smaller. The statistics here may provide some indication but should not be quoted as numbers or shares of people in hunger.

Please read a report about another of our partnerships...

Garden seed was given to every family that received food and we also took food a feeding program that we help support, they feed 65 children three days a week.

One of the things that touch me in the distribution was when one of the doctors was talking to an older man and told he had to eat for his health. And he looked at her and said, "I have no food to eat."

In September we started, thanks to help of many, serving those that had been effected by the rains. In September and October we served over 700 families with food, medicine, spiritual and emotional care. Knowing that we cannot do it all our decision was to focus on specific communities, serve those communities and returning to serve them till things had become stable in their communities. In October God blessed us to secure two full containers of food, those containers were provided by a number of different groups working together. It all was started with HUNGER PLUS, INC. of Plainview, TX making the connections with Feeding the Nations and they made the contact with Feed My Starving Children and Gleanings. Transportation was provide by funds secured by Dr. Ed Enzor at Global Samaritan and from Poor Box in Alaska secured by a connection made for us by David Catalina at Global. I guess this is what you say Partnership is all about.

I can't believe I have been here in Jinotega for a week and it's time to leave. As I mentioned in my prevous report, I came down to work in food distribution with Benny and the mission staff. We also were joined by Teresa and Marian, two ladies from Jacksonville. Teresa worked with Dr Peña and Marian came to hold a teachers seminar on recognizing and helping children who have suffered trama (lack of food) among other things and to teach VBS to the kids in the communities we visit.

The plan for the week was to provide medical treatment as we distributed food on Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Marian's suitcase with all the material for the seminar and VBS was left in Miami by AA so we had to wait for the Monday noon flight. It arrived and we left for Jinotega Monday afternoon. The remainder of Monday was used to settle in and prepare for the seminar to be held on Tuesday.

The mission staff had coordinated with 3 community leaders for our visits: San Gabriel, Wiwili and La Concordia. The container with the food was scheduled to arrive Tuesday. As you may guess it didn't. So, we hoped it would arrive on Wednesday. We had enough food in our warehouse to distribute in San Gabriel, a small community just 30 minutes North of Jinotega on Wednesday. When we returned from San Gabriel we were told the container would not arrive on Wednesday so we were forced to cancel the Wiwili trip (Wiwili is a 4 hour drive North of Jinotega). Then about 5 PM Wednesday afternoon, after most of the staff had gone home for the day, we received word the container was on it's way and would be in Jinotega at 8 PM. Most of the staff was contacted and at 8 PM the container arrived and we were ready to unload it. Keep in mind all the unloading is done by hand. This means the pallets had to be broken down and the boxes hand carried to the warehouse a distance of about 200 feet. The container was only food and here is the scope of the work: 38 pallets, 36 boxes per pallet, 33 lbs per box, 13 people unloading. It took the group just about 3 hours to move 1,368 boxes or 45,144 lbs of weight.

Thursday morning everyone was back at the mission at 7:30AM. When we were told the container would arrive Dr. Peña called the Director of the Ministry of Health here in Jinotega on Wednesday evening and asked for a community in need of food and medicine. He identified a small community up in the mountains called Chagiuite (my pronunciation cha-we-ta) Grande. So off we went to Chagiuite Grande about 1 hour North of Jinotega. What a great community. The people we friendly, the view was gorgeous and the weather was mild. It made for a great day. Of course the food and medical treatment was appreciated.

On Friday we traveled to La Concordia and set-up shop in the church there. This was the largest community we visted during the week. The Mayor and his staff were right there with us all day helping make sure as many families received food and medical treatment as possible. This ended our distribution for the week. The mission staff did a superb job of planning, organizing and executing their plan. When faced with adversity they showed flexible and adjusted quickly. Here are the numbers for the week: 539 families received food; est. 4.5 people per family -- that means 2,425.5 people were fed and enough food was given to help them supplement their meals for 3 weeks to a month. The two doctors saw between 475 and 500 people. In addition to the food directly distributed by the mission we left a total of 40 boxes (total for all 3 communities) of food for the Mayor's office, community leaders and church to distribute to families that couldn't get to us.

I know this is longer than I usually send but I wanted all to know the great work you are doing. There is a weather cell just Southeast of us. Current forecast would have it coming directly over Nicaragua so please pray that it doesn't become a tropical storm or stronger or bring to much rain to Nicaragua.

I will returning home on Tuesday the 16th. My next trip is scheduled for Nov 29th and I will stay until Dec 16th. This trip will be to continue to distribute food but, we will also (good Lord willing and the container arrives) distribute SMILE boxes. I will also use this time to plan and coordinate work for our groups arriving in January 2011. Ann may accompany me on this trip. We also have several others coming at this time to work with the mission.

Food Shipment Update

JB, the food delivery process to the villages and communities is nearing completion, and I hope to have more information with some pictures for you soon. But here is the amazing story that is unfolding about this shipment which I should not delay in telling you about.

During the procedure of getting approval from the Mexican authorities to transport the soup and pickles across the border, our missions co-ordinator, Lisi Porchas, got a surprise call from the Municipal Presidente of the State of Sonora, Manuel de Jesus Balderama, whose main office is in the City of San Luis. Presidente Baldarama called Lisi from Mexico City where he was attending government meetings. In his call, he thanked Lisi for JEM's ministry to the poor and expressed his appreciation to Hunger Plus and all responsible for the donation of the food we were planning to bring across the border and distribute in Northern Sonora. When he called, he had already been aware of your help JB and Hunger Plus from Lisi's discussions with the border authorities.

After the Presidente expressed his appreciation he offered to send trucks to the warehouse in Yuma to help us transport the food across the border. Lisi accepted his offer since it would have taken us at least two days and more to transport the food in the smaller vehicles we had arranged for. The Presidente also sent the Vice-Presidente to accompany the trucks and meet Lisi and some of our Mexican pastors who had arrived in Yuma thinking that they would be transporting all of the goods themselves. Once across the border, the food was delivered to a steel warehouse workshop belonging to one of the Mexican brother's in our JEM ministry. From this location, the majority of the food was separated into portions for distribution to the very poor in the villages and communities of the Sonora area that we minister in.

Before the food was distributed to the communities, JEM gave a portion to DIF (Mexican social services) for their feeding program of the poor and destitute in downtown San Luis. This is an agency that we have worked very closely with in the areas of health and education in the rural communities we minister in. The agency was completely out of food the day we crossed the border, and they started using the portion of food we gave them immediately and were extremely thankful for it. The Vice-Presidente told Lisi that the funding was very low for this purpose, and when they were able to allocate a few hundred dollars of emergency funds for this feeding program, they usually had to go across the border to buy food from the Yuma food banks. Lisi and I have been in the DIF facilities that store and feed the downtown people, and it is a deplorable situation to say the least.

JB, the Presidente, in his discussion with Lisi, also told her that there would no longer be any obstacles from his government for us to bring supplies across the border. In fact, in addition to the food, he cleared the way for us to bring some windows and over 2000 lbs of building materials across the border from Ray Williams warehouse. He also said that he would be writing appreciation letters to the organizations involved and would be arranging a meeting with Lisi to tour our church communities and observe for himself these poverty stricken areas and their needs.

This story that has definitely increased our acceptance with the Mexican authorities is just beginning to unfold in the Lord's Grace. I cannot guarantee that the promises Lisi heard (even more than I have mentioned) from the Presidente will all be fulfilled, but we have been told by reliable sources that he is a christian brother and is a doctor & surgeon by profession. This has greatly encouraged us, and we believe that the Lord is orchestrating things for His Glory in all that is happening. I will keep you posted, JB.
